

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION OF
THE VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON WHICH WAS HELD MONDAY NOVEMBER 1, 2004
AT THE NORTH BARRINGTON VILLAGE HALL
111 OLD BARRINGTON ROAD

1. Call to Order and Roll Call:

At 7:40 p.m. Chairman Cassidy Towne called the meeting to order. The Deputy Clerk called the roll:

The minutes from the September 13, 2004 meeting were made available to the Commission.

Motion: Chairman Cassidy Towne moved to approve the minutes from the September 13, 2004 meeting; seconded by Cathy Howes.

Discussion: There was no discussion.

Vote on the Motion:

The voice vote was unanimous in favor.

Chairman Cassidy Towne declared the minutes of the September 13, 2004 meeting approved and put on file.

2. Final Update on Fall Festival

The Parks & Recreation Commission agreed that the Fall Festival was a success. Vice Chairman Kathy Kubick estimated that 700 people were in attendance. The Commission is putting together the final figures. They discussed the possibility of monitoring the attendance to ensure that only North Barrington residents attend next year. The option of a clown and a magic show were also discussed. The Commission may also invite a difference musician to perform next time. A future Fall Festival date at the end of September instead of the beginning of October may be considered. Holding the Festival from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm will not change.

3. Update on Eton Park-soccer goals and Brian Thomson

Chairman Cassidy Towne informed the Commission that the Fossil soccer players would remove the soccer nets at Eton Park. Chairman Towne submitted a bill from Brian Thomson for the aeration and seeding of Eton Park.

4. Update on East Oxford Trail

Vice Chairman Kathy Kubick reported that she had spoken with Acting President Craig Parker and a decision has been to pave over the culvert at the entrance to the walking trail on East Oxford. An additional fence may be installed to form a more definitive entrance to the trail. The Commission agreed that they would like to be included in any decision made in regards to the walking trail and the process of installing a fence.

5. Update on the Art Sculpture

Bob Wulff reported that the artist is still incapacitated and most likely will not be able to complete the sculpture. Bob has been unable to reach him. The Commission acknowledged that the accounting books must be closed on this issue. The Commission discussed the possibility of investigating another artist to erect a war memorial and decided that Trustee Kelly Mazeski would bring the subject up at the next Board of Trustees Meeting.

6. New/Old Business

The Commission discussed the proposed 2005 Parks & Recreation Meeting dates and agreed the dates would work.

The Commission discussed installing a permanent bathroom at Eton Park and ideas for landscaping around the bathroom. The idea of a permanent bathroom will be researched.

The Commission discussed having several outdoor concerts at Eton Park again this summer. Pat Ryan has expressed an interest in performing.

7. Adjournment

Motion: Vice Chairman Kathy Kubick made a motion to adjourn the meeting; seconded by Gregg Steliga.

Discussion: There was no discussion.

Vote on Motion:

The voice vote was unanimous in favor.

Chairman Cassidy Towne declared the motion approved.

At 8:30 p.m. Chairman Towne declared the Meeting adjourned. The next Meeting will be held December 6, 2004 at 7:30 p.m.
